- Volunteer your time and energy into making it a positive environment for your son.
- Encourage your son to talk to the coaches with any concerns on and off the field.
- Never discuss a concern before or after a game.
- Talk to me about any concerns, not Gabe Pagano (AD).
- Set up a time to discuss a concern you may have (never before or after a game).
- Give all snacks or drinks to your son before the game not during.
- Notify me of any scheduling conflicts well in advance.
- Remember that some pains, struggles and failure are what make our children better people.

- Ways to help your son improve his baseball skills.
- Concerns about your son's behavior.
- Concerns about your son's health.
- Concerns about your son's academics.
- Concerns about your son's future.

THINGS YOU CANNOT DISCUSS WITH THE COACHES

- Never discuss playing time with the coaches. Parents are naturally more interested in their child than the overall success of the team.
- Never discuss team strategy with the coaches.
- Never discuss other athletes with the coaches.
